Background In the existing in effect Peterborough County OP there is a lake classification which states Highly Sensitive or “At Capacity” Lake Trout Lakes

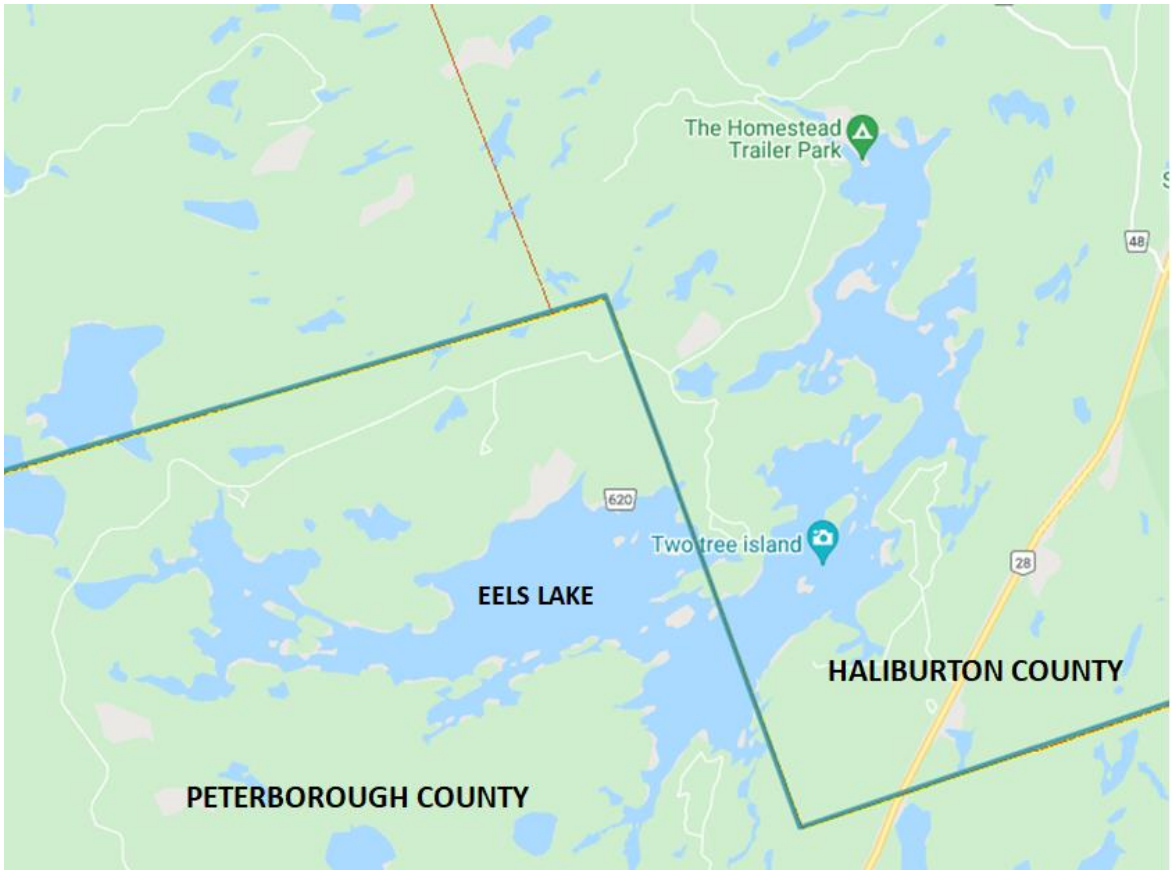

This map shows Gilmour Bay area which connects through Gilmour Bay Channel to Chandos Lake -Confusion exist as to what properties are included in the at capacity section. I once was the realtor for the property identified as **IS THIS LOT IN GILMOUR BAY?** ..This lot had significant development potential based on frontage and area but it was not possible to get an interpretation as to whether new lot creations would be restricted based on at capacity since boundary of Gilmour Bay was not available .Whether that property is included in the at capacity boundaries significantly affect the property value.



This map of Eels Lake shows the boundary between two counties but uncertain if that in fact is the at capacity boundary



Recommendation That for both Gilmour Bay and Eels Lakes that OP text include clear illustration so the boundaries for applicable sections of these lake to be affected by at capacity policies and subsequent regulations are clearly understood. In the event Eels Lake is all of Lake in North Kawartha that could be noted without need for mapping
